Navy Life Boat Station

Description: The Navy Life Boat Station is a 3.1-acre abandoned compound on Neah Bay, next to the U.S. Coast Guard station, that formerly comprised damaged buildings, concrete foundations, construction debris, and underground and aboveground storage tanks. Built by the Navy and transferred to the Coast Guard in 1946, the site was formerly used as a small boat repair base. Leased to Crown Zellerbach Corporation from 1948 to 1958, when it was transferred back to the Tribe.

Community Impacts: Diesel- and oil-contaminated soil.

Investigations and Actions to Date: Site inspections conducted in October 2000 and April 2004. Limited remedial investigation conducted in December 2002 to January 2003. Asbestos and lead-based paint investigation of the barracks, garage and gymnasium additions conducted in October 2004. Derelict buildings, underground and aboveground storage tanks, and some petroleum-contaminated soil were removed from May 2005 through March 2006.

Planned Activities: Remove contaminated soil associated with former storage tanks.
