

# SITE FACT SHEET

## Radar Dome Area *Site 5*



**Description:** The 10-acre site, which is located on Bahokus Peak and formerly consisted of five buildings and one radar dome, was leased for the proposed Harbor Defense Command Post of the Cape Flattery Battery in the early 1940s; this site was later used by the Army Air Forces as an aircraft radio relay warning station. It was leased by the Air Force as part of the Makah AFS in 1950s and used as an Air Defense Command early warning radar station until 1988, when it was transferred to the FAA, which constructed the current radar dome in 1995. Building foundations, underground storage tanks, a septic tank, gravel access roads, parking areas, and structures associated with the former installation remain on site.

**Community Impacts:** Potential impacts to soil and ground water from underground storage tanks; possible abandoned septic tank system.

**Investigations and Actions to Date:** Site inspections were performed by the Makah Environmental Restoration Team in October 2000 and March to April 2004.

**Planned Activities:** Conduct test pit investigation of underground storage tank sites; inventory asbestos-containing materials and lead-based paint; remove asbestos-containing materials; remove abandoned structures and contaminated soil.
