

## SITE FACT SHEET

### Family Camp and Trailer Court *Site 14*



**Description:** Site 14 is an abandoned trailer court and campground located at the mouth of Hobuck Creek, near Bahobohosh Point. The area was acquired in the early 1940s by the Seattle Air Defense Wing to construct living quarters for troops and was later developed by the Air Force and used as a trailer court and family campground until the Makah AFS closed in 1988. In 2006, paved areas, water and electricity hook-ups, playground equipment, wooden fencing, a small transformer, a restroom, and other small buildings were removed or restored by the Makah Business Enterprises department. A creosote-treated wood-stave water tank is uphill approximately 150 feet northeast of the trailer court.

**Community Impacts:** Abandoned septic tank systems and creosote-treated water tank.

**Investigations and Actions to Date:** Site inspections were performed by the Makah Environmental Restoration Team in October 2000 and in March and April 2004. The site was investigated along with 9 other sites during the 2004 limited remedial investigation; asbestos and lead-based paint samples were collected. An asbestos inspection was conducted in June 2005; no asbestos-containing material was found. Makah Business Enterprises removed debris and abandoned structures in 2006 so that the site could be restored for use as a recreational vehicle park. The restroom building was restored and new electrical hook-ups were installed.

**Planned Activities:** Conduct test pit investigation of septic tank systems; remove underground septic tank systems and associated contaminated soil; remove wood-stave water tank.
