

SITE FACT SHEET

Bahobohosh Point *Site 15*



Description: Site 15 is near the mouth of Sooes River on the top of the hill at Bahobohosh Point. Remaining features include concrete foundations, a small building footing, earthen (sand and rock) berms, and an abandoned gravel access road. In 1943, the Seattle Air Defense Wing leased this 28.4-acre area from the Tribe; leases on an additional 54.84 acres of individually allotted Tribal lands were negotiated between the DoD and the individual allottees. Living quarters for troops and a radar site were constructed in 1943. The remains at this site are likely the former radar foundations.

Community Impacts: Abandoned structures; disturbed terrain.

Investigations and Actions to Date: Keres Consulting performed a Phase I site assessment in October 2002. Site inspections were performed by the Makah Environmental Restoration Team in October 2000 and April and October 2004. During the October 2004 site visit, steel rods protruding from the concrete foundations were cut off flush with the foundations to remove the physical hazards.

Planned Activities: A No Further Action report has been prepared, recommending that the Makah Tribal Council make and record a No Further Action determination.
